This supply was sufficient to last one month or so.

More than 120 families have benefited from this food program since we started phase 1 in May to Phase 8 in December.

CANDIDATES BACK TO SCHOOL

Kenya cautiously reopened Schools, Colleges and Universities on 12th October of 2020, after an extended break caused by the COVID-19 pandemic that forced the closure of schools in March.

The Education Ministry authorized learners in Grade 4, Standard 8, and Form 4 to start reporting to school for physical learning, as parents wait to know when other classes will begin again.

The schools were reopened under stringent measures, including social distancing in class, wearing face masks, and obtaining water at designated points for cleaning hands. During the long COVID-19 break, the rate of early pregnancies among learners in the home was identified as a critical concern. And as schools resumed physical learning, Cabinet Secretary of Education Magoha said no girl would be denied a chance to continue their studies because of pregnancy.



The schools were reopened to enable preparations for the Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE) examinations, which will start on March 22, 2021, and end on March 24, 2021. while KCSE examinations will begin on March 25, 2021, and ending on April 16, 2021.

TALK THERAPY TO SAAS STUDENTS.


We held these talks several times during the year. Sylvia and Maria ran the girl's talk while Freddy and Danny took over the boys' conversation.

It was a neutral forum for everyone to share their feelings, fears, and challenges, among others. We noticed many of them had low self-esteem and lacked confidence in themselves due to their environment. Many said their parents weren't supportive in giving them emotional and educational support. According to the students, parents are incredibly harsh, especially now that Corona virus has to transform their lives into misery. They have no time for their children, so it is difficult for them to share their problems.

We concluded that communication was the key problem among the families. This is spiced up by parents being too busy to acquire basic needs, hence causing children to confide their issues to their neighbors and friends who in turn mislead them. We agreed that these would change and we shall address these issues when we meet up with their parents.
