The term was brief, with very few co-curricular activities as the focus was on academics. especially for Grade 6, Class 8 and Form 4 students who sat for their national examinations in November and December. Schools closed on the last week

of October to give room for the chools in Kenya opened on candidates to sit for their national examinations. The students are home for the long holiday from November to December.

> Some 1.28 million students sat for the Grade 6 Kenya Primary School Education Assessment (KPSEA) exams and are set to transition to Grade 7, the first class of their Junior Secondary School life.

Another 1.4 million pupils sat for

the Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE) exams in November. This was the final KCPE exam after 35 years of the 8-4-4 education curriculum in Kenya. The country is transitioning to the new Competency Based Curriculum (CBC). Over 900,000 students sat for the Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE). They are set to join university next year.

Kenya marks 60th Jamuhuri Day Celebrations

Lenya marked her 60th
Jamuhuri Day celebration on
December 12. SAAS joined
the world in wishing Kenya a
happy 60th Jamuhuri Day celebration.

Jamuhuri is a Swahili word which means republic. The day marks when Kenya gained complete independence and became a republic in 1963. This was six months after gaining self-internal rule on June 1, 1963 (Madaraka Day).

The military occasionally uses

the day to grant infantry battalions their formal Presidential and regimental colours. Upon being conferred the colours, the honoured unit proceeds with the Trooping of the Colour ceremony.

In such a ceremony, the president, the commander in chief, is

formally dressed in the ceremonial Kenya army red tunic uniform. Once the flags are consecrated by an Anglican and Catholic bishop and a Muslim Kadhi, the president officially hands the colours to two flag bearers who receive them while down on one knee.
