SAAS directors Mr David and Mrs Ebby will meet with church representatives from Kilquade and Greystones Parish in 2025.

The meeting slated for February is very significant as it will further cement the collaborative workmanship between parishioners and SAAS, which has made it possible for destitute children in Kenya to attend school.

Kilquade and Greystones Parish continue to be critical strategic partners for SAAS in its quest to provide academic empowerment to impoverished children drawn from Kongowea slums and its environs in Mombasa, Kenya.

Over the years, the benevolent acts of the parishioners have enabled over 100 children to attend school. Their unwavering support has helped us pay school fees for these children who were in despair.

We are greatful for the partnership and look forward to supporting more children in 2025.

Kenyan schools will reopen in the second week of January 2025 as the students proceed to their next respective classes. Learners under Kenya's new Competency-Based Curriculum (CBC) will progress to Grade 9, signaling the end of Form 1 students under the old 8-4-4 education curriculum.

In 2023, some 1.4 million primary school students sat for the Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE) exams. This was the last KCPE exam for primary school students in Kenya after 32 years since its inception, as Kenya now fully embraces the new CBC curriculum in schools. There were no KCPE candidates in 2024, meaning we will not have new Form 1 students in 2025.

The Competency-Based Curriculum (CBC) under the 2-6-3-3 education system in Kenya was unveiled in 2017 to replace the 8-4-4 education system, which has served Kenya for 32 years.

Learners will not sit exams, but they will be evaluated on the skills acquired through Continuous Assessment Tests (CATs) instead of cramming for exams, as has been the case.

The 2-6-3-3 model emphasizes formative years of learning, with learners spending a total of eight years—two in pre-primary (kindergarten) and six in primary.

Junior Secondary (grades 7, 8, and 9) and Senior Secondary Education (grades 10, 11, and 12) will each take three years.
