SCHOOL CALENDAR

Students had a one-week break in the middle of September that marked the end of term 2. In late September, the schools were opened for term three. It is the last term for the year 2022, it's also the final term that marks the end of the COVID school calendar.

From January of next year, the school calendar will resume its normality three terms' a year. Also, it is in January when students will be moving classes. We wish our students all the best as they tackle this term.

COMPETENCE-BASED CURRICULUM (CBC)

It's a new educational curriculum recently introduced in Kenya in 2017 to replace the old system of 8-4-4. CBC is used in Kenya to deliver learning and evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of learners. Under this system, the children will be monitored and evaluated over 2-6-3-3-3 years. It's divided into Early years of education, middle school education, Senior school, tertiary, and university. Pupils who are in grade 6 are currently the first people to undergo this system. They are looking forward to their national exams in late November 2022. they will later join junior secondary for three years as evaluation continues till the university level.

Students in Kenya who are in grade six, class eight and form four are preparing to sit for their national examination in late November and December. Thanks to the teachers who ensured that students have prepared well for this exam. SAAS has more than 60 students who will sit for the form 4 national examinations. In September, the SAAS youth group enrolled 16 students for computer packages. The turnout of the students was low since the majority have joined colleges and universities. NEW PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF KENYA

The former deputy president William Ruto was sworn in as the fifth President of Kenya at Kasarani International Stadium in Nairobi. Ruto took the Oath of Office on 13th September at 12.44 pm in a swearing-in process led by the Judiciary under Chief Justice Martha Koome.

His deputy, Rigathi Gachagua, was also sworn in shortly after him. The event was attended by tens of head of states and diplomats from across the world. They included East African Community presidents among others.

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AUGUST GENERAL ELECTION 2022

General elections were held in Kenya on Tuesday, 9 August 2022. Voters were given a chance to elect the President, Deputy President, Governors, Senators, members of the National Assembly, Women Representatives, and Members of the County Assemblies of Kenya (MCA).

General elections in Kenya are held every five years. The turnout of voters was very low and we are glad it was peaceful. On the 15th of August, the results were announced by Wafula Chebukati, chairman of the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) who declared William Ruto was elected President of Kenya.

His opponent Raila Odinga was not happy with the results and so Odinga filed a petition at the Kenyan Supreme court challenging Ruto's victory. The court took its time to listen to the cases presented and On 5 September, the Kenyan Supreme Court rejected the challenge and upheld Ruto's victory.
