Census

Kenya is one of the few African countries that have held censuses every ten years since independence. In this area, Kenya is also unique in that the census is fully financed through taxpayer's money, which underlines the importance that the Government carries out this national exercise. The exercise started on 24th August at 6pm and ended on 31st August 2019.

For the first time, all the data required for the Census were captured electronically through a tablet computer. The questions were being loaded on to the gadget and the whole enumeration processes was therefore paperless. This guaranteed that the data will be captured faster than has been the case during previous censuses. It also ensures that the data will be more secure and that the census results will be available sooner than was previously possible.
