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SAAS marks 17 year Anniversary

On February 2023, SAAS marked 17 years of existence and imparting knowledge to thousands of children in Mombasa, Kenya.

SAAS was founded 17 years ago by two Irish people, one of whom is the current executive director Gina Woods.

In the early years, SAAS could sponsor only a few students. Still, thanks to benevolent donors, Kilquade Parish, Cavan County Council, Avolon and Greystone Parish. SAAS annually supports over 200 students to school, all of whom come from the Kongowea slum in Mombasa, Kenya.

SAAS's mission is to give the impoverished a secondary school education. We found that some donors are also continuing with sponsorship through college or

The charity is tiny, with just three employees in Mombasa, Kenya, that is Maria Nekesa, Fredrick Onyango and Silvia Masere, and five directors based in Ireland, Georgina Woods, David

Maguire, Lucy Hayes, Paul Cran and Ebby Soinani, all of whom work full-time and support SAAS in a voluntary part-time capacity.

The camp had an attendance of over 60 students per day. Mathematics was the main subject taught in addition to Physics, Biology and Chemistry.

The students selected topics they were struggling with, and the tutors were ready to assist them.

We had five tutors for the camp; Patrick Zuma, Graham Oyigo, Abraham Charles, Neema Sara and Michael Musembi.

KCPE, KCSE and KPSEA National exams

The government of Kenya administered three levels of national exams to some 3.4 million candidates spread across the country last December.

The exams included the Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE), which saw some 1.24 million students sit the exams.

The Kenya Certificate of Secondary Edu-

cation (KCSE) candidates were 884,263.

About 1,287,597 Grade 6 students sat for their inaugural Kenya Primary School Education Assessment (KPSEA) exams that saw them get a promotion to join Grade 7, which will now be part of Junior Secondary School

Junior Secondary is part of the new Com-

petency-Based Curriculum introduced by the Kenyan government in 2022. The CBC curriculum replaces the 8-4-4 curriculum, where students studied eight years in primary school, four years in secondary school and four years in university.

Form 1 Intake and Bursaries

Schools in Kenya officially opened on the 23rd January 2023. We have 69 new SAAS students who all joined Form one, of which 32 are male and 37 are female. We have 50 students in boarding schools, while 19 are in day schools.

From the list, 18 are sponsored by Grey-stone Parish, while our new sponsors, Mr and Mrs Stewart, are supporting 40.

The students will go for their mid-term break on March 23, with the term expected to end on April 21 for a two-week holiday.

The office also issued bursaries to 61 students in high school. The beneficiaries included 36 male and 25 female students.

who went through the program. They work as volunteers.

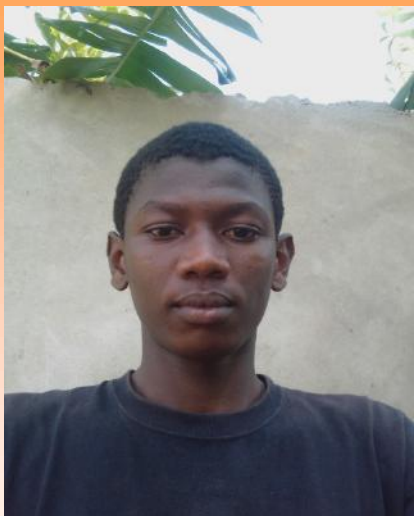
We have Wellington, Daniel, Moses, Abraham and Fletcher, who have volunteered to teach for the January intake.
